


Right here. West of what you know.





To call Confluence Park just a “park” might be an understatement. “Heart of our community” might be a better description. Because this is where people can gather for ... well, pretty much anything. Two unique swimming pools encourage everything from amateur splashing to Olympic-scale lap swimming. A spa provides a relaxing respite. Poolside cabanas let you

beat the heat in luxury. And one-of-a-kind play structures will keep the kids entertained for hours. Green thumbs (or those aspiring to be) will love spending time at the Garden Home, complete with flower and vegetable beds, workshops and more. No wonder this popular spot has won so many awards.



A better way to move.

The best way to get from here to there? The Eastlink greenway: a network of walking, biking and Neighborhood Electric Vehicle paths that connect to Confluence Park now, and are planned to lead to more parks and open space in the future. There's also a pump track for those who want some two-wheeled fun, a bike repair stand (for those who maybe had a little too much two-wheeled fun), and a shaded pavilion for relaxing or rehydrating. Cars? Who needs cars?

More than 400 movies, commercials and TV shows have been filmed on the adjacent piece of our property known as Newhall Ranch. The area has passed for Africa, Vietnam, and even a futuristic desert. (Not bad for a little slice of California.)

Work from trail.



With a name that nods to Southern California's Spanish heritage (and the orange crops that used to grow on this land), Valencia is no stranger to ranching and agriculture. And the area's rich and storied tradition — one that spans centuries, from the Native Americans to the Gold Rush pioneers — lives on to this day. "Urban agriculture" shows up in ways like small-scale localized farming practices and modern, sustainable food production. And right here in our community, we consider it an important legacy to carry forward.

You'll find it in the Garden Home, a green retreat (with a resident-run garden club) designed to deepen your relationship with nature. Or in the community garden,

where you can exercise your green thumb by participating in seasonal harvests for everything from heirloom tomatoes to Armenian cucumbers to edible flowers. And we have some pretty great help. Farmscape, a local urban farming company, hosts quarterly events and workshops that help our residents enjoy the bounty of the local crops. (We like our information locally sourced, too.)

No matter where you choose to gather, learn and grow, you'll find the opportunity here. We've made sure of it. Because like those who came before us, we're committed to maintaining a healthy connection to the land we're so honored to call home.



AS FRESH AS IT GETS.

There's a new certified Farmers Market in town. Every Sunday from 8:30am to 1:00pm, Valencia FivePoint Farmers Market is your source for seasonal fruits, crisp veggies, artisan breads, handcrafted pastries, and locally raised meats and fresh eggs ... all from California's family farms. That's not all. Ready-to-eat foods will be available to enjoy while shopping the market. Sundays just got a lot more fun!

Here at Valencia, students don't just have multiple schools at their fingertips, they have multiple school districts. Three of the most highly rated in California, in fact. Which means whether you're looking for public or private, preschool or college prep, kids in K-12 get the tools they need to realize their full potential. There's even a college nearby (but more on that in the sidebar).

HERE ARE THE SPARK NOTES

- Elementary students (K-6) are part of either the Newhall or Saugus Union School District, with a combined total of 25 schools. Kids get the benefit of indoor/outdoor classrooms, an engaged teaching staff, and arts & STEM learning opportunities. There are a number of charter schools and junior kindergartens in the area as well.
- Students attend one of the six middle schools or seven high schools in the William S. Hart Union High School District. The educational opportunities at these schools are incomparable, giving kids the ability to gain skills that will carry them into adulthood – through vocational electives, and specialty programs like the four-year engineering pathway at Saugus High or Valencia High's Medical Science Academy.

Of course, all learn and no play is no fun. Which is why Valencia is a great place for kids to just be kids. With quiet, bike-friendly streets. Trails for roaming and parks for playing. And no shortage of pint-sized pals to explore it all with. You could say it's like recess all day, every day. Maybe even better.

PEP RALLY

Sports are a pretty big deal in the William S. Hart Union High School District. The hard-working athletic teams play everything from football to track & field, and have earned multiple California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) and state championships. And don't be surprised if you come across a few former district students on Division 1 or professional teams. They're that good.



HI, HIGHER LEARNING

Considering that the majority of high school graduates choose to extend their studies, we're lucky to have fantastic colleges nearby. College of the Canyons is a community college offering degrees in over 200 subjects – and local high school students can get a head start by taking free classes before they've even graduated. And just a mile down the road, the world-class California Institute of the Arts (CalArts) offers undergraduate and graduate degrees in visual art, film, music, theater and more.



LIFE IS A potluck

We believe in bringing people together. Since the very beginning, Valencia has been designed for people first. And sure, the parks, trails and pools that bring people out of their homes are an important part of that. But take a closer look and you'll see that when you have a mix of homes, you get a mix of people. And that makes for a more interesting place. When you have a beautifully blended bunch of different lifestyles and stages, professions and cultures, interesting things start to happen. A neighborly outdoor movie night grows to a whole-community outdoor movie night. A group of work-from-home biotech engineers starts a lunchtime run club. Residents meet to compete — and then eat — in a homemade salsa contest. And so on, and so on. It's people coming together, telling their stories, sharing their talents, and caring about each other. (You know, that whole "community" thing.)

At Valencia, we not only have access to nearby trails, we have our own hiking club, where residents meet up twice a month to explore them together.




MAKING SUSTAINABLE

attainable



At Valencia, we are paying diligent attention and taking unprecedented action to conserve natural resources and protect the environment.



At the forefront of our sustainable mission is the permanent preservation of approximately 10,000 acres of funded and managed natural open space (for reference, that's about 7,500 football fields, and about two-thirds of our community's overall size).

Valencia® is designed to be one of the nation's first mixed-use communities of its size to achieve net zero emissions of greenhouse gases from its construction and operations. Through a variety of sustainable measures, we're quickly becoming a proof of concept for how to reduce carbon emissions and facilitate healthier living for generations to come. Energy-efficient appliances, windows, lighting and HVAC systems and low-flow kitchen and bathroom fixtures are just a start.

Beyond reducing carbon emissions, the homes at Valencia also help reduce energy costs. New homes are built with photovoltaic solar panels — with some also using electric heat pumps for space heating and cooling, replacing gas-powered A/C condensers. And each home in the first village will come with a level 2 EV charger, making it easy to swap out gas-guzzling cars (and making oil changes a thing of the past).

Conserving natural resources, protecting the environment, reducing the carbon footprint and increasing our quality of life? That's a win-win-win-win situation.

All the homes in Valencia are Energy Star® certified, which means they use, on average, 20% less energy than homes built to code.*



Valencia is a place born from a simple idea — that neighborhoods should be designed for people first. It's why our current plans for the community includes a variety of choices for mobility, from an NEV trail network and pathways for electric bikes and scooters, to mobility hubs, charging stations for electric vehicles, and more.

It's also why we created VALENCIA GOSM — a community-wide, comprehensive transportation management organization designed to provide new options and choices for people on the move (and reward them for making sustainable choices). Right now, many new Valencia homeowners can apply to receive exclusive subsidy reimbursements to put toward the one-time purchase of an eco-friendly mode of transportation.

Best Rock Climbing


